Maybe it's silly...

The other day while in Costco, a forklift went by. The smell of the propane engine of the forklift sent me immediately back to "American Can Factory #99, Alameda". I worked there for two summers some 40 years ago. Forklifts buzzed around the plant carrying can parts to machines or finished products to awaiting trucks. I made three times the minimum wage at the time, \$3.75 an hour! The money helped me through college and the work was a significant incentive to get a college degree!

Bonnie's exercise class is held across the parking lot from an Indian restaurant in Monterey. Simply walking by the place and breathing in the aroma of spices can take us immediately back to our college year spent in Bangalore. I learned so much in that year about myself and my faith. I met and fell in love with Bonnie Minkler; we would often eat together at a cheap, vegetarian restaurant, devouring a huge masla dosa, with idli and sambar. The smells of that food even today, 40 plus years later, bring back a flood of memories, all good!

I've been blessed with a number of silent retreats at the New Camoldoli Hermitage in Big Sur. During worship and meditation they often burn incense. The Benedictine order emphasizes simplicity and community. Their worship is based on the singing of the Psalms in ritualized chanting; a style of chanting that aims to include everyone. Their chapel is visually stunning, a work of art. Their Eucharist includes homemade bread and wine. All of the senses are activated to engage with God, including smell. Orthodox worship includes burned incense for this very reason; engaging all the senses. It reminds us of the Biblical references to the incense and the pleasing aroma of the burnt offerings in the ancient Temple of Jerusalem.

The God of Creation gave us all five senses. Worship has been one primal way of connecting us with them to bring us fully awake to the divinity in life itself.

Contemporary Protestant worship does a good job of incorporating sight and sound, with digital arts and music. Maybe the coffee and donuts before or after the worship service, and the "greeting" time when we go around shaking hands can stimulate our taste and touch. But we lack any intentionality when it comes to smells. In fact we avoid them in the sanctuary as potentially allergenic.

It might be no big thing but I wonder if we lose that sensual connection to the God of all Creation when we so sanitize our worship environments of smell. Just imagine the memories evoked by the smell of a Christmas tree or of grandma's ham baking in the oven for the family's Easter feast.

I don't mean to be silly, but let me ask anyway; what smells bring you joy? What smells bring back fond memories? For us modern Protestants, what smells remind us of God?
