



Several weeks ago while relocating the church nursery, I came into the Sunday school room looking for a few spare baskets. Upon opening a cabinet full of baskets and looking into the first one, I immediately recognized that this cabinet held all the materials for the "Godly Play" Sunday school program.

As a former children's minister, I have heard a great deal about the Godly Play curriculum and I understand it to be a high quality program that creates meaningful worship for children and engages multiple-age groups of children during Sunday school. Ironically upon first coming to this church, in my mind I thought of this program and what benefits it would have for a church like ours. Three of the biggest roadblocks for most churches to implement this program are that materials are expensive, it requires a dedicated Sunday school room, and it requires adults that understand children and are good story tellers. The fact that the materials are already purchased and a room is saved for Sunday school was something that excites me!

Right now I am in a learning stage with Godly Play. My goal is to get the materials that we currently have for each story organized. After that, I plan to start small. My goal is just to prepare five Sunday school lessons that can be available for a time that we have children in worship.

If you feel like you could be an addition to these organizational efforts or you would like to learn about Godly Play along with me, I would invite you to join in. I would also be looking for anyone in the congregation that would be a Story Teller for the children.
